



## The Los Lunas Substance Abuse Treatment and Training Center

### Overview

- The Los Lunas Substance Abuse Treatment and Training Center is designed to provide, essential, state-of-the-art substance abuse treatment services in two facilities to residents of Valencia County and the entire state.
- Projected initial groundbreaking: December 2009
- Center will be located on 10 acres of state land across from new Valencia County Judicial Complex (Morris Road and State Road 314).

### Funding

- FY 08 and FY 09 Funding – HSD received \$900,000 of general fund (GF) monies to hire a provider, begin development of programs, training for service delivery and plan/design two facilities: An Intensive Outpatient Treatment and Training Facility (IOPTT) and a Women with Children Residential Treatment facility (WRT).
- FY 08 and FY 09 Funding - GF and Severance Tax Bonds (STB) appropriated by the Legislature and approved by the Governor totaled \$10 million. This funding is being used to program, design, furnish and construct the center.
- Services rendered will be paid with Medicaid and existing General Fund Substance Abuse Treatment monies.
- FY 10 Funding – HSD received \$650,000 of GF monies to continue planning and training for the substance abuse treatment programs.
- FY 11 Funding Request – HSD is requesting \$4.5 million of FY 11 funds for 12 months of FY 11 operational expenses and \$6 million of FY 11 capital project funds to complete site and design work, construct and furnish the two facilities.

### Treatment and Training Center Details

#### Intensive Outpatient Treatment Service Component

- Intensive Outpatient Program (IOPTT) Facility will be a state owned facility.
- Nine to twelve hours of specialized intensive treatment per week per client for individuals with severe addiction disorders and individuals with co-occurring psychiatric and substance use disorders.
- Projected Annual Capacity is 840 men, women and adolescents.
- Projected Opening January 2011

#### Training Component

- The Training Center within the IOPTT facility will be used to conduct state of the art trainings for up to 1,200 law enforcement, judicial system employees and behavioral health providers annually.
- The Training Center will have the technological capability to offer training and consultative services to rural and frontier areas via telehealth and telemedicine linkages.
- Projected Opening January 2011

#### WRT Service Component

- Women Residential Treatment Facility (WRT) will be a state owned facility.
- 16 beds for women with capacity for up to 24 children of women in treatment.
- Projected opening is late 2011



## Center Management

- In March 2008, Partners in Wellness (PIW) was selected by an impartial stakeholder committee to manage and operate the center. PIW has a proven track record in substance abuse treatment.
- In 2009/2010 PIW began providing community based outpatient treatment and linkage services at the local Income Support Division building in Los Lunas.
- In 2009/2010, PIW will participate in a series of Best Practices trainings designed to develop staff expertise in substance abuse to the greatest degree possible.
- In 2010 an advisory group of stakeholders formed to facilitate development sensitive to the needs of the community, the courts and the state.
- Services at the IOP and WRT will be provided by 60 staff to be hired by PIW.
- Interface residential services, treatment training/workforce development and court system to effectively mitigate the individual, family and community effects of severe addiction disorders.
