Overview of Department

Since the establishment of the Aging and Long-Term Services Department (ALTSD), constituents, providers, state agencies, tribal representatives, and legislators participated in numerous bipartisan taskforces to determine how state government could efficiently and effectively support older adults, adults with disabilities, and their caregivers.

ALTSD provides a clear and focused approach to meet the needs of New Mexicans, creating an integrated system of services for constituents with the ability to address their concerns in a timely manner, prevent duplication of services, and maximize economic efficiency.

Overview of Divisions

ALTSD consists of the Office of the Secretary and four Divisions, which provide direct access to critical resources for older adults and persons with disabilities. The Office of the Secretary (OOS) includes the Cabinet Secretary, Deputy Secretary, Office of General Counsel, Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program, Office of Indian Elder Affairs, Office of Policy and Planning, Office of Alzheimer's and Dementia Care, New Mexico Conference on Aging, Special Projects, Information Technology, and Human Resources.

The Administrative Services Division (ASD) includes the Capital Projects Bureau, financial management, budgeting, procurement, contracting, and administrative support to the programs.

The Consumer and Elder Rights Division (CERD) includes the New Mexico Aging and Disability Resource Center, Live Web Chat, Care Transitions Bureau, State Health Insurance Program, Senior Medicare Patrol, Prescription Drug Assistance Program, and the New Mexico Veteran Directed Care Program.

Aging & Disability Resource Center assists elders, persons with disabilities and caregivers to find services and resources to help them live well and independently.

Aging and Long-Term Services Department (ALTSD)

MEW MEXICO AGING & LONG-TERM SERVICES

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Overview of Divisions (continued)

The Aging Network Division (AND) includes the Senior Services Bureau, which provides financial, technical and programmatic support for the Area Agencies on Aging for Planning Service Areas (PSAs; see next page for maps), the Senior Employment Programs Bureau, the Senior Corps Volunteer Programs, Legal Resources for the Elderly Program, and New Mexico Senior Olympics. The Aging Network Division also provides support for the New Mexico Conference on Aging and houses the budget for the Office of Alzheimer's and Dementia Care and the Office of Indian Elder Affairs, while also provide support to other aging network contractors.

The Adult Protective Services Division (APS) provides a system of protected services to persons aged 18 and older who are unable to protect themselves from abuse, neglect or exploitation. Investigations are conducted through a network of regional field offices, which cover all New Mexico counties. When necessary, APS provides short-term services, including emergency protective placement, home care, adult day care, attendant care and filing of guardianship petitions in district courts.

Indian Area Agency on Aging (I-AAA) The IAAA supports Indian elders' unique cultural and traditional needs and promotes services that improve their quality of life. IAAA staff serve as advocates for New Mexico's Indian elders. The IAAA has developed an area plan for strengthening and coordinating services such as training, information & assistance, transportation, volunteer opportunities, nutrition programs, and health promotion activities.

Long-term Care Ombudsman Program Provides a voice for vulnerable adults who might otherwise go unheard through regular visits to nursing homes and assisted living facilities, we help residents by advocating for their rights, investigating complaints, helping to resolve concerns, and ensuring the quality of care they deserve.






OVERVIEW OF DIVISIONS

Protective Services (PS) is charged with investigating reports of children in need of protection from abuse and neglect and taking action to protect and promote the well-being of those children whose safety cannot be assured. Whatever the extent of a child's involvement with PS process (such as investigation, client services, placement, or permanency), we are committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of PS involved children and providing permanency in a timely manner.

Juvenile Justice Services (JJS) provides effective delinquency prevention through interventions that emphasize community-based alternatives. We are committed to keeping our children safe and preparing them to be contributing members of society by providing treatment and rehabilitative services tailored to their needs, while also holding our clients accountable and protecting public safety.

Behavioral Health Services (BHS) is the behavioral health authority for all children in NM. BHS is the lead on children's behavioral health policy in collaboration with other State Agencies to include HSD, DOH, PED, ECECD, and the Behavioral Health Collaborative.

Children Youth and Families Department (CYFD)



PullTogether is a community engagement initiative intended to bring all New Mexicans together to truly make a difference in the lives of our children and make New Mexico the best place to be a kid. Through PullTogether, New Mexicans in need can find resources available through state and local agencies, businesses, and nonprofits, such as where to find low-cost childcare assistance, free summer meals, substance abuse and behavioral health treatment and services, and tips on how to keep children safe. PullTogether also serves as a resource for New Mexicans who want to make a difference in their community. Whether through adopting or fostering a child, donating a backpack to a child in need, reporting child abuse or neglect, or even for a job at CYFD.

Early Childhood Education and Care Department (ECECD)

OUR MISSION:

Optimize the health, Department, education, and well-being of babies, toddlers, and preschoolers through a family-driven, equitable, community-based system of high-quality prenatal and early childhood programs and services.

VISION:

Each and every New Mexico child, prenatal to age 5, and their families will have equitable access to quality early learning opportunities to support their Department, health, and well-being, ensuring they are ready to succeed in kindergarten and beyond.

STRATEGIC GOALS

Goal 1: Families: Recognize all families in NM as key decision makers and ensure they have access to the resources they need to thrive.


Goal 2: Governance: Create a cohesive governance system that supports an aligned, efficient, and responsive system of high-quality early childhood programs and services.

Goal 3: Workforce: Ensure NM's early childhood workforce is supported to meet the needs of all families and young children through an aligned professional Department system and through compensation that reflects the level of experience and training.

Goal 4: Funding: Provide sustainable and secure funding to support NM's youngest children and their families.

Goal 5: Data: Develop statewide, integrated data system to better inform planning and decision-making for all stakeholders.

Goal 6: Tribal: Strengthen ongoing government to government relationships with tribal communities in order to foster mutual trust, understanding, and partnerships that respect tribal sovereignty.



Early Childhood Education and Care Department (ECECD)

OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMS

Child Care Services: The Child Care Services Bureau administers the Child Care Assistance and the Child Care Regulatory Oversight programs, to ensure equal access to high-quality, healthy, safe, and supportive child care environments. The child care assistance program helps parents/legal guardians who are working, going to school or in a job training program with child care expenses.

Families FIRST Program: Assists families and caregivers in gaining access to medical, social, and educational services that are necessary to foster positive pregnancy and birth outcomes to promote optimal health for infants and children in New Mexico. Provides case management services to Medicaid eligible pregnant women and children birth to three years old.

Family Infant Toddler (FIT) Program Early Childhood Intervention: Provides services and support to families whose children are either babies, one-year-olds, or two-year-old's. Children qualify if their Department is delayed or if they are at risk for a Departmental delay. Services are provided by qualified professionals directly to parents and children in a child's home or in a community. The purpose of the services are to build the parent's skills in addressing the child's Departmental needs. Services are provided under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

Family Nutrition Bureau: Family Nutrition Bureau administers two USDA child nutrition programs: the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) and the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). CACFP provides reimbursement for healthy meals and snacks to child and adult care facilities; SFSP provides meals for low-income children up to 18 years of age during the summer when schools are closed.

Head Start State Collaboration Office: The Head Start Collaboration Office facilitates collaboration and partnerships between Head Start (tribal and non -tribal), state agencies and other state entities that provide services to benefit low -income children and their families. Early Head Start and Head Start programs deliver services to children and families in core areas of early learning, health, and family well-being while engaging parents as partners every step of the way.

OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMS (cont.)

Home Visiting: Administer, monitor and support NM Home Visiting programs to support families in strengthening their parenting skills, connecting them with supports in their community, and attaining the emotional and physical wellness needed to care for and educate their young children.

New Mexico PreK: The NM PreK Bureau oversees the administration, monitoring, quality supports, and technical assistance for NM PreK in traditional public schools, charter schools, and community-based organizations. In collaboration with PED, the NM PreK Bureau administers PreK funding and ensures that all NM PreK children with special education needs receive the services and supports they need. New Mexico PreK helps young children develop a strong foundation for future learning, health, and behavior.

Human Services Department (HSD)

OUR MISSION: To transform lives. Working with our partners, we design and deliver innovative, high-quality health and human services that improve the security and promote independence for New Mexicans in their communities.

DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

The Department is led and directed by the Office of the Secretary (OOS) with four program divisions: Child Support Enforcement Division, Income Support Division, Medical Assistance Division, and Behavioral Health Services Division. OOS provides leadership and direction for the agency and its services in coordination with other state agencies, the Governor's Office, legislature, and community partners.

The divisions and offices in **Program Support** contribute to all tasks and activities addressed in the Human Service Department Strategic Plan and include the Office of the General Counsel, Office of Inspector General, the Office of Fair Hearings, Office of Human Resources, the Administrative Services Division, and Information Technology Division.

Behavioral Health Services Division

The Behavioral Health Services Division (BHSD) is the Mental Health and Substance Abuse State Authority for New Mexico and addresses need, services, planning, monitoring and continuous quality systemically across the state. HSD runs the adult portion of the state's behavioral health care.

Behavioral Health Collaborative

HSD is a member of the New Mexico Behavioral Health Collaborative, which works to establish policy and implement strategies to manage the behavioral health system. This cabinet-level group represents 15 state agencies and the Governor's office. The vision of the Collaborative is to be a single, statewide behavioral health delivery system in which funds are managed effectively and efficiently and to create an environment in which the support of recovery and development of resiliency is expected, mental health is promoted, the adverse effects of substance abuse and mental illness are prevented or reduced, and behavioral health recipients are assisted in participating fully in the lives of their communities.

Human Services Department (HSD)

Child Support Enforcement Division

The Child Support Enforcement Division administers the state and federal program to collect support from Non-custodial Parents. Its primary mission is to maximize the collection of child support for all New Mexico children. Child Support Modernization through Senate Bill 140 (effective as of July 1, 2021) includes efforts to base child support guidelines on combined parents' actual income and non-custodial parents' ability to pay, allows the ability to modify a child support order for the child's health care needs, and reduces the timeframe for establishing retro-active child support from 12-years to three to improve child support collections and reduce debt.

Income Support Division

The mission of the Income Support Division is to relieve, minimize or eliminate poverty and to make available certain services for eligible low-income individuals and families through statewide programs of financial assistance, food assistance, employment assistance and training services. Income Support processes applications to HSD programs and services.

Information Technology Division

Under the direction of the Human Services Department's Chief Information Officer (CIO), the Information Technology Division (ITD) provides timely and cost-effective information technology services to the department, its programs, divisions and offices. This support enables the department to fulfill the mission of HSD in an efficient and responsive manner, and ensures that HSD gains full benefit from its current and future investments in technology.

Medical Assistance Division

The Human Services Department's Medical Assistance Division (MAD) is the direct administrator of the New Mexico Centennial Care program. See pages 253-254 for detailed Centennial Care 2.0 overview.



- Advocating for tribal interests at state and federal levels through policy and legislative work;
- Supporting tribes with access to resources, technical assistance, and funding opportunities; and
- Connecting tribes with the executive branch, other tribes, and with the tools and resources they need to be self-governing and self-sufficient.





OVERVIEW OF INITIATIVES

- Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Relatives
 (MMIWR) Task Force Act establishes collaboration with tribal
 governments, tribal law enforcement, and U.S. Department of
 Justice to determine the scope of the problem, identify barriers,
 and create partnerships to improve processes for reporting and
 investigating cases. IAD led MMIWR Task Force in development
 of a state response plan.
- Established Indigenous Youth Council (IYC) to improve young peoples' holistic wellness and elevate the Native American youth perspective.
- IAD developed Tribal Response Plan to provide support and guidance to our tribal governments when responding to COVID-19, supporting tribes in vaccine distribution and on-going requests to mitigate spread of COVID-19.
- Administered historic investments in tribal communities through the Tribal Infrastructure Fund and Capital Outlay.
- Established Tribal Water Working Group which is leading tribal input into the 50 Year Water Plan.
- Developed a draft consultation guidebook and toolkit and updated cultural competency trainings for state employees.
- Partnered with UNM to provide suicide prevention and wellness seminars to provide behavioral health supports to tribal communities.

Indian Affairs Department (IAD)

OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMS

- Tribal Infrastructure Fund: Through this competitive funding, all federally recognized tribes, nations and pueblos within New Mexico have an opportunity to submit a robust project proposal for their community.
- Special project grant funding is not intended to be a permanent funding source for entities but rather a short-term allocation. Consequently, projects should demonstrate progress towards self-sustainability.
- Capital Outlay funds are used to build, improve or equip physical property that will be used by the public.
- Tobacco Cessation and Prevention Programs: These programs are focused on building tribal capacity to implement culturally appropriate tobacco cessation and prevention initiatives that recognize the unique ceremonial uses of tobacco while reducing the use of commercial tobacco use and its harmful effects.


U.S. Population Percent Change by State, 2010-2020


New Mexico Population Percent Change by County, 2010 –2020










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New Mexico Population by Age and Gender as a Percent of Total Population as of 2020






New Mexico Children (Under 5 Years) Resident Population by County as of 2020


New Mexico Older Youth (Ages 14-17) as Percentage of All Minors (Under 18) by County as of 2020







New Mexico Older Adult (65+ Years) Resident Population by County as of 2020



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New Mexico Percent Older Adult (65+ Years) Resident Population by County as of 2020






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


New Mexico Projected Percent Older Adult (65+ Years) Resident Population by County, 2030


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New Mexico Veteran Population as Percentage of Total Population by County as of 2018






New Mexico White Resident Population by County as of 2020


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New Mexico Native American Resident Population by County as of 2020





New Mexico Black/African American Resident Population by County as of 2020





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
New Mexico Asian, Pacific Islander and Other Race Resident Population by County as of 2020

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U.S. Per Capita Personal Income by State as of 2020








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New Mexico Per Capita Personal Income by County as of 2020









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U.S. Unemployment Rate by State as of October 2021








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New Mexico Unemployment Rate by County as of October 2021





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
U.S. Poverty Rate by State as of 2019



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
New Mexico Poverty Rate by County as of 2019







New Mexico Poverty Rate of Children (Under 5 Years) by County as of 2019





U.S. Poverty Rate Minors (Under 18 Years) by State as of 2019





New Mexico Poverty Rate of Minors (Under 18 Years) by County as of 2019





New Mexico Poverty Rate Older Adults (65+ Years) by County as of 2019





New Mexico Poverty Rate Adults (18+ Years) with Disabilities by County as of 2019






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U.S. Households with Grandchildren and Grandparents as a Percentage of Households with Children by State, as of 2019






New Mexico Households with Grandchildren and Grandparents as a Percentage of Households with Children by County, as of 2019


New Mexico Number of Internet Service Providers (ISPs) Available by County, 2021

New Mexico Percent Coverage* with Broadband Speeds at 25 Megabits per Second (mbps) or More by County, as of July 2021






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
New Mexico Percent Coverage* with Broadband Speeds at 100 Megabits per Second (mbps) or More by County, as of July 2021












New Mexico Number of Food Insecure Children by County as of 2019




U.S. Child Food Insecurity Rate by State as of 2019

New Mexico Child Food Insecurity Rate by County as of 2019




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U.S. Number of Food Insecure Residents by State as of 2019


New Mexico Number of Food Insecure Residents by County as of 2019




U.S. Food Insecurity Rate by State as of 2019

New Mexico Food Insecurity Rate by County as of 2019




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U.S. Senior (60+) Food Insecurity Rate by State as of 2019

U.S. Senior (60+) Very Low Food Security Rate by State as of 2019





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

New Mexico Projected Number of Food Insecure Children by County as of 2020







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



New Mexico Projected Child Food Insecurity Rate by County as of 2020









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



New Mexico Projected Number of Food Insecure Residents by County as of 2020









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



New Mexico Projected Food Insecurity Rate by County as of 2020







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
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New Mexico Number of Medicare/Medicaid Dual Eligible Adults in Managed Care by County as of October 2021



U.S. and New Mexico Percent of Adults (18+) With No Health Care Coverage, 2011-2020




New Mexico Percent of Adults (18+) with Preventive Services Coverage vs No Coverage, 2019 & 2020

New Mexico Primary Care Physicians Full-Time Equivalent Count by County per 10,000 Population as of 2020



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
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U.S. Number of ICU Beds by State per 10,000 Population as of 2018





Number of General Beds by State per 10,000 Population as of 2018





New Mexico Assisted Living Facilities by County as of October 2021



New Mexico Hospitals by County as of October 2021



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

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New Mexico Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF) by County as of October 2021



New Mexico Nursing Homes by County as of October 2021



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




New Mexico Medicaid Home and Community Based Providers (1915C) by County as of October 2021



New Mexico Psychiatrists Full-Time Equivalent by County per 10,000 Population as of 2020



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
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New Mexico Core Mental Health Professionals Full-Time Equivalent per 10,000 Population as of 2020


New Mexico Medicaid Psychiatric Providers by County, 2021


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
New Mexico Medicaid Core Behavioral Health Providers by County, 2021



U.S. Percent Change in Predicted 12 Month-Ending Count of Drug Overdose Deaths, by Jurisdiction: April 2020 to **April 2021**









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New Mexico Reported Opiate Overdose Reversals using Naloxone by County, 2020




New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grade 9-12) who used at least one Substance* in the past 30 Days by High-Risk Groups, 2019

U.S. and New Mexico Alcohol-related Deaths per 100,000 Population, 1990-2019



U.S. and New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grade 9-12) who Drank Alcohol at least Once in the past 30 Days, 2005 - 2019




New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grade 6-12) who Drank Alcohol at least Once in the past 30 Days by Grade Level, 2019

New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grade 6-12) who Used at least One Form of Tobacco on at least one of the past 30 Days by Grade Level, 2019



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
New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grades 9-12) Using Cigarettes or E-cigarettes at least Once in the past 30 Days, 2009 - 2019



New Mexico Percent of Adults (18+) Using Tobacco and E-Cigarettes by Demographic Factors, 2020





New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grade 9-12) with Lifetime History of Forced Sexual Intercourse by Risk Groups, 2019




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
New Mexico Percent of Adults (18+) who Experienced Sexual and Intimate Partner Violence by Race/Ethnicity, 2020

New Mexico Behavioral Health Visits for Anxiety, Depression and Trauma per 1,000 Population, January - December 2020








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New Mexico Adult Hospitalizations per 100,000 Residents for Depression by Race/Ethnicity and Sex, 2019


New Mexico Adult Hospitalizations per 100,000 Residents for Anxiety by Race/Ethnicity and Sex, 2019





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
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New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grades 9-12) Who Felt Sad or Hopeless* in the last 12 Months by Sex and Gender Identity, 2019



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
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
U.S. and New Mexico Percent of Youth (Age 12-17) with Major Depressive Episode, 2012-2019



New Mexico Most Common Youth (Age 5-17) Mental Health Hospitalizations by Diagnosis and Sex per 100,000 Residents, 2019




New Mexico Youth (Grades 9-12) Suicide Attempts by Sex, Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Housing Status, 2020


New Mexico Rate of Suicides (Age-Adjusted) Per 100,000 Residents by Race/Ethnicity, 2019


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U.S. and New Mexico Rate of Suicide Deaths (Age-Adjusted) Per 100,000 Residents, 2010-2019





New Mexico Suicide Deaths per 100,000 Population by Age Group, 2019






New Mexico Percent of Youth (Grade 9-12) Engaging in Unsafe Traffic Behaviors, 2019


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New Mexico Unintentional Injury Deaths by Age Group per 100,000 Residents and Selected Mechanism of Injury, 2015-2019


New Mexico Leading Causes of Unintentional Injury Death, by Cause of Injury, 2015-2019



New Mexico Violent Firearm-Related Deaths By Owner of Firearm, 2018-2019*



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

New Mexico Percent of Obese Youth (Grade 9-12) by Sex, 2005-2019





U.S. and New Mexico Child (Age 0-17) Asthma Hospitalization Rates per 10,000 Population, 1999-2020





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
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New Mexico Child (0-17) Asthma Hospitalization Rates by Health Region, 2016-2020


U.S. and New Mexico Child (Age 0-17) Asthma Emergency Department Visit Rates per 10,000 Population, 2010-2020



New Mexico Child (Age 0-17) Asthma Emergency Department Visit Rates by Health Region, 2016-2020




New Mexico Rate of Cleft Lip with or without Cleft Palate per 100,000 Live-Births by Public Health Region, 2011-2019



U.S. and New Mexico Occupational Injury Fatalities Per 100,000 Full-Time Equivalent Workers, 2007-2019




New Mexico Percent of Older Adult (<45) Falls* by Race/Ethnicity, 2020


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U.S. and New Mexico Unintentional Older Adult (65 or +) Fall-Related Deaths Per 100,000 Residents, 2009-2019



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

U.S. and New Mexico Rate of Older Adult (65 or +) Fall-Related Deaths Per 100,000 Residents by Gender, 2017-2019



New Mexico Percent of Adults (>45) with Cognitive Decline, 2020





U.S. Rate of Older Adults (65+ Years) Living with Alzheimer's per 100,000 Population as of 2019

New Mexico Alzheimer's Disease Death by County Age-Adjusted per 100,000 Population as of 2019






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New Mexico Prevalence of at least Two Chronic Conditions by Income Level, 2020





New Mexico Prevalence of Diabetes among Adults by Age, Race/Ethnicity, Gender, 2020




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New Mexico Prevalence of any Cardiovascular Disease (CVD) by Age, Race/Ethnicity, Gender, 2020



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
New Mexico Healthcare-associated Infections by Standardized Infection Ratios (SIR), 2015-2020


U.S. Percent of COVID-19 Vaccines Delivered that have been Administered by State, as of November 10, 2021



U.S. Percent of Population Fully Vaccinated for COVID-19 by State, as of November 10, 2021







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
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
U.S. Percent of Population with at least One Dose of COVID-19 Vaccine by State, as of November 10, 2021


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
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New Mexico Cumulative COVID-19 Cases Per 100,000 County Population, as of October 25, 2021






New Mexico COVID-19 Deaths per 100,000 County Population, as of December 1, 2021









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
New Mexico COVID-19 Infection Rates by Census Tract Poverty Group, 2020

New Mexico COVID-19 Hospitalization Rate by Poverty Level, as of November 29, 2021







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
New Mexico COVID-19 Case Fatality Rate by Poverty Level as of November 29, 2021










New Mexico Syphilis Rates per 100,000 Population by County, 2019




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
U.S. Percent Adults (18+ Years) with Disabilities by State as of 2019


New Mexico Percent Adults (18+ Years) with Disabilities by County as of 2019


U.S. and New Mexico Age-Standardized Total Disability-adjusted Life Years (DALYs) Rates, 2000-2019

New Mexico Total Live Births to NM Residents by County, 2020






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
New Mexico Rate of Teen Births by County, 2020





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
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New Mexico Total Deaths among NM Residents by County, 2020



New Mexico Adult (18+) Rates of Individual Ambulatory Care Sensitive Conditions (ACSCs) per 100,000 Population, 2018-2020












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New Mexico Number of West Nile Virus Cases by Clinical Syndrome, 2003-2021 as of October 26, 2021



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



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New Mexico Children Youth and Families Department (CYFD) Children Served in Foster Care by County, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2021





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
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New Mexico Department of Health (DOH) Monthly 911 Responses to COVID-related Syndromes, August 2019 -October 2021




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New Mexico Department of Health (DOH) Developmental Disabilities and Supports Division (DDSD) Individuals Served by Waiver Type as of October 1, 2021


New Mexicans Receiving Services from the Department of Health (DOH) Developmental Disabilities and Supports Division (DDSD) by House Districts as of August 2021


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
New Mexicans Receiving Services from the Department of Health (DOH) Developmental Disabilities and Supports Division (DDSD) by Senate Districts as of August 2021



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
New Mexicans on the Wait List for Services from the Department of Health (DOH) Developmental Disabilities and Supports Division (DDSD) by County as of October 29, 2021

New Mexico Nurse Aid Program School List by County as of October 2021



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




Destination Hospitals Grouped within the Individual Hospital Line







New Mexico Department of Health (DOH) Medical Cannabis Program Number of Patients by County as of September 2021 Medical Cannabis Patients





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
New Mexico Department of Health (DOH) Medical Cannabis Participants from Other States as of October 2021



New Mexico Early Childhood Education & Care Department (ECECD) Child Care Program Providers by County as of June 2021





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

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
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
New Mexico Early Childhood Education & Care Department (ECECD) Child Care Program Percent of Children Served by Federal Poverty Level (FPL) as of June 2021






New Mexico Human Services Department (HSD) Program Recipients by Age and Gender as a Percent of Total as of October 2021

New Mexico Human Services Department (HSD) Program Recipients by Race and Ethnicity as a Percent of Total as of October 2021



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

New Mexico Medicaid Behavioral Health non-Prescribing Providers by County as of October 2021






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Number of Medicaid Beneficiaries Who Access Services per Behavioral Health Provider by County for January-September 2021







New Mexico Non-Medicaid Behavioral Health Services by Housing Status and Disorder, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 21


New Mexico Non-Medicaid Behavioral Health Practitioners Serving Youth by County as of October 2021



New Mexico Non-Medicaid Behavioral Health Youth Served by County as of October 2021





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



New Mexico Non-Medicaid Behavioral Health Expenditures by County, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2020





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
New Mexico Non-Medicaid Behavioral Health Expenditures by County, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2021



New Mexico Adults Served by Medicaid and Non-Medicaid Behavioral Health by County, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2021









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New Mexicans Served by Methadone Program, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2021







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New Mexico Child Support Collections by County Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2021








New Mexico Medicaid Program – Overview of Centennial Care 2.0 Programs

Centennial Care entered its eighth year in 2021 and has effectuated a modernized healthcare delivery system in NM that focuses on improved access to care, integrated care, care coordination, and quality of service using its four guiding principles:

- To create a comprehensive service delivery system that provides the full array of benefits and services.
- To encourage personal responsibility, so that members become more active participants in their health and more efficient users of the health care system.
- To advance Payment Reform strategies that reward improved outcomes rather than for the quantity of services delivered.
- To simplify the administration of the program for providers and members.

Centennial Care operates under a five-year 1115 demonstration waiver which will expire December 31, 2023. The Medical Assistance Division (MAD) will draft a concept paper in 2022 outlining the principles and goals and will engage stakeholders throughout the development of for the next five-year waiver. Additionally, the current Centennial Care Managed Care Organization Contract will expire December 31, 2023. MAD will work to issue a Request for Proposals for Managed Care Organizations in 2022 to award new contracts effective January 2024. This is a significant opportunity to identify the areas of greatest potential impact for our Medicaid members and to design a program that best serves New Mexico.

Managed Care Organizations (MCOs): Blue Cross/Blue Shield of New Mexico, Presbyterian Health Plan, Western Sky Community Care

Public Health Emergency (PHE) regarding Coronavirus (COVID-19): On January 31, 2020, the Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health emergency for the U.S. to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19. This declaration is retroactive to January 27, 2020. In response to the PHE, HSD requested several federal authorities and were approved for the following:

New Mexico Disaster Relief State Plan Amendments (SPAs): HSD submitted six Disaster Relief SPAs and received CMS approval for the following:

- Expands the list of qualified entities allowed to do Presumptive Eligibility
- Temporary increases to DRG rates for ICU inpatient hospital stays by 50% and all other inpatient hospital stays by 12.4%;
- Coverage and reimbursement for testing and testing related services to the uninsured population (COVID-19 Testing Group);
- Targeted Access UPL Supplemental Payments;

- Nursing Facility Rate Increases applied when treating fee for service COVID-19 members;
- Increased hospital stays services from April 1, 2020 June 30, 2020;
- Increased rates to non-hospital providers for E&M, non-E&M, and dental services;
- Reimbursement for the administration of the COVID-19 Vaccine; and
- Reimbursement for the administration of the COVID-19 Vaccine to homebound members by EMT personnel.

1135 Waiver: HSD submitted a 1135 waiver and received CMS approval for the following:

- Suspending prior authorizations and extending existing authorizations;
- Suspending PASRR Level I and II screening assessments for 30 days;
- Extension of time to request fair hearing of up to 120 days;
- Enroll providers who are enrolled in another state's Medicaid program or who are enrolled in Medicare;
- Waive screening requirements (i.e., Fingerprints, site visits, etc.) to quickly enroll providers;
- Cease revalidation of currently enrolled providers;
- Payments to facilities for services provided in alternative settings;
- Temporarily allow legally responsible individuals to provide PCS services to children under the EPSDT benefit.

Appendix Ks: HSD submitted five Appendix Ks and received CMS approval for the following:

1915c Waivers (Medically Fragile, Mi Via, Developmental Disability, and Supports Waiver)

- Exceed service limitations (i.e., additional funds to purchase electronic devices for members, exceed provider limits in a controlled community residence and suspend prior authorization requirements for waiver services, which are related to or resulting from this emergency);
- Expand service settings (i.e., telephonic visits in lieu of face-to-face and provider trainings also done through telehealth mechanisms);

- Reducing provider qualification requirements by allowing out-of-state providers to provide services, allowing for an extension of home health aide supervision with the ability to do the supervision remotely;
- Utilizing currently approved Level of Care Assessments to fulfil the annual requirement or completing new assessments telephonically;

New Mexico Medicaid Program – Overview of Centennial Care 2.0 Programs meet the needs of people on HCBS waitlists and family caregivers. Section 9817 of the ARP provides

- Modifying the person-centered care plan development process to allow for telephonic participation and electronic approval:
- Modifying incident reporting requirements;
- Temporarily increase payment rates; and
- Allow for payment for the purpose of supporting waiver participants in an acute care hospital or short-term institutional stay when necessary supports (including communication and intensive personal care) are not available in that setting or when the individual requires those services for communication and behavioral stabilization, and such services are not covered in such settings.

1115 Demonstration Waiver for Home Community Benefit Services (HCBS)

Expand service settings (i.e., telephonic visits in lieu of face-face and provider

- trainings also done through telehealth mechanisms); Permit payment for services rendered by family caregivers or legally responsible individuals if not already permitted under the waiver;
- Modifying provider qualifications to allow provider enrollment or re- enrollment with modified risk screening elements;
- Modification to the process for level of care evaluations or re-evaluations;
- Modifying person-centered service plan development process to allow for telephonic participation and electronic approval;
- Modifying incident reporting requirements;
- Allow for payment for services: and
- Retainer payments for personal care services.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Investments: COVID-19 PHE has brought to light the risks of institutional and congregate settings for older adults and people with disabilities, underscoring the urgent need to reduce the reliance on institutional services and expand access to high-quality HCBS to improve outcomes for people with long-term services and supports (LTSS) needs. HCBS allow millions of Medicaid beneficiaries to receive services in their own home or community rather than institutions or other isolated settings able to receive care in home and community settings.

The American Rescue Plan Act (APRA) of 2021 presented State Medicaid Agencies with an unprecedented opportunity to identify and implement changes aimed at addressing existing HCBS workforce and structural issues, expand the capacity of critical services, and begin to


qualifying states with a temporary 10 percentage point increase to the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) for certain Medicaid expenditures for HCBS beginning April 1, 2021 and ending March 31, 2022. States have until March 31, 2024 to spend the additional funding they draw down. This funding also provides states an opportunity to enhance individual autonomy and community integration in accordance with the home and community-based settings regulation, Olmstead implementation, and other rebalancing efforts. With significant stakeholder input the MAD submitted the initial spend plan in July of 2021 with thirty-one proposals and received partial approval in November 2021. 
Native American Collaboration: The 2009 State-Tribal Collaboration Act codified an effective government-to-government communication and collaboration between state and Tribal governments. The Act provides the framework for the state and Tribes to work together to develop successful programs and services to benefit New Mexico's Tribes, Pueblos, Nations and Native American citizens. In 2020, with the onset of the COVID pandemic, HSD has worked extensively with the Tribes, Pueblos, and Nations in New Mexico to provide access to needed personal protective equipment, food, lodging, shelter, medical care, and transportation. The Medical Assistance Division and the Income Support Division have accessed federal waivers to increase Medicaid and SNAP benefits to New Mexico families.

The Native American Technical Advisory Committee (NATAC) was established in September 2012 as a subcommittee of the Medicaid Advisory Committee to give the Tribes, Pueblos, and Nations an opportunity to meet with the New Mexico Medicaid Director on a quarterly basis. The focus of these meetings is to continue discussion regarding Medicaid, including Centennial Care 2.0, Behavioral Health services, Income Support Division services, Tribal Notifications and the Indian Managed Care Entity (IMCE). HSD seeks the guidance from tribal leaders and their representative on how best to deliver services to their communities in this forum. HSD continues to work with IHS/Tribal 638 facilities to develop the process for 100% Federal Medical Assistance and New Mexico has consistently been a leader in ensuring most of its eligible members are Percentages (FMAP) for services received through an IHS/Tribal 638 facility and furnished to Medicaid eligible Native Americans. Efforts include 100% FMAP for IHS/tribal 638 Pharmacy Outpatient Prescription refill and signed Care Coordination Agreements (CCA) between:

- UNMH and Albuquerque Area Indian Health Service (AAIHS)
- Presbyterian Health Services and AIIHS
- UNMH and Navajo Area Indian Health Service




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
State Fiscal Year (SFY) 21 Medicaid/CHIP Expenditures for New Mexico, Pro-rated by County as of September 2021



State Fiscal Year (SFY) 21-22 Incremental Medicaid/CHIP Expenditures for New Mexico, Pro-rated by County as of September 2021





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
Ratios of Federal to State Dollars Funding New Mexico Medicaid/CHIP Population, Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 22 (projection)




Ratios of Federal to State Dollars Funding New Mexico Medicaid/CHIP Population, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 22 (projection)

U.S. Percent of Residents Enrolled in Medicaid & CHIP, by Jurisdiction, May 2021








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New Mexico Medicaid & CHIP Recipients by County as of October 2021








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

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New Mexico Medicaid & CHIP Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2021










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

New Mexico Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2021








New Mexico Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) Benefit Issuance by County as of October 2021








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New Mexico Cash Assistance Program Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2021







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New Mexico Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2021 Percent of Population










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
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New Mexico General Assistance Program Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2021





New Mexico Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Recipients by County from October 2020 to September 2021 Number of Recipients








New Mexico Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County from October 2020 to September 2021










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

New Mexico Transitional Food Stamps Program Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2021










New Mexico Community Action Program Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Households Served by County Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 21




New Mexico Public Education Department (PED) Number of Students by County as of October 2021



New Mexico Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) Clients Served by County October 2020 - September 2021





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
Emergency Food Assistance Program Food Bank Areas of Assistance by County, Federal Fiscal Year 2022 (FFY22)



New Mexico Meals Served at Soup Kitchens and Shelters Monthly January-August 2021





New Mexico Emergency Support Function (ESF) Total Sheltered with Non-Congregate Shelter by County, January-November 2021


