

# Monthly Statistical Report July 2015

#### **Highlights**

- The SNAP caseload in July 2015 was 234,139, a 13 percent increase from one year ago. The SNAP caseload has risen by 2009 cases, or 0.9 percent, since last month.
- The TANF caseload was 12,767 in July 2015, an decrease of 9.8 percent from July 2014. The TANF caseload had 13 cases more than June 2015, a decrease of 0.1 percent.
- The caseload for General Assistance was 3,267 in July 2015, a increase of 21 percent from one year ago and an increase of 32 cases from last month.




#### **Intensive Case Management, Recovery and Employment (ICARE)**

The I-CARE (Intensive Case Management, Recovery and Employment) program began in 2013 as a pilot program in Albuquerque. The I-CARE program now provides services in Albuquerque, Espanola, Las Cruces and Roswell. It is designed to address substance use barriers to employment for TANF participants. These TANF participants identified as having substance use issues that prevent them from obtaining and retaining employment are referred to the I-CARE program. The I-CARE program also addresses other addictions that contributes to or in combination of substance use. This program is designed around 12 weeks of Intensive Job Readiness and/or Life Skills Group sessions, 1:1 Intensive Counseling, and 1:1 Career Development sessions, in a supportive and non-judgmental environment. ICARE is a voluntary program where participants engage in daily activities to meet their hours of work participation. I-CARE includes motivational interviewing to motivate change and decrease substance use; relapse prevention to build skills; family management to improve family functioning; job readiness classes to enhance employment skills and increase retention; living in recovery life skills; and job development to secure employment. A program evaluation component will be used to determine the effectiveness of this program in addressing substance use disorders among TANF participants.


# NM Works Activity Placements on July 31, 2015 as reported by SL Start \*\*



#### Number of New Employments in July, by region, as reported by SL Start Statewide Total: 275






