THE PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY ACT

The Parental Responsibility Act (NMSA 1978 §40-5A), which became effective July 1, 1995, requires the Human Services Department (HSD) to report to the Governor and the Legislature by December 1st of each year on the progress of child support enforcement measures, including: 1) the number of delinquent obligors certified by the department; 2) the average number of obligors who also were licensees or applicants subject to the provisions of the Parental Responsibility Act (PRA); 3) the number of licenses suspended or revoked by each board and the number of new licenses and renewals that were delayed or denied by each board; 4) the number of licenses and renewals that were granted following an applicant's compliance with a judgment and order for support; 5) the number of administrative hearings held by the licensing entities; and 6) the cost incurred for the year in the enforcement of the PRA.

SUMMARY OF EFFECTIVENESS

Since the PRA was enacted in 1995, the HSD Child Support Enforcement Division (CSED) has collected \$29,028,095.23 in lump-sum payments, and for the past reporting year, matched 8,307 of delinquent obligors to licensees or applicants and issued 5,372 Certificates of Compliance (CoCs). The itemization of the dollar amounts collected by CSED is noted in the table on the page that follows.

CSED continues to work with each of the 65 state entities to refine, streamline, and strengthen PRA procedures. The licensing entities report to CSED on a monthly and annual basis on the work they have performed to be in compliance with the PRA.

During the reporting from November 1, 2015 through October 31, 2016, CSED License Suspension staff worked closely with the Taxation and Revenue Department Motor Vehicle Division to resolve customer concerns related to the implementation of their new computer system and provided support to entities for new staff taking over duties and responsibilities related to the monthly reports sent to CSED.
