V. BACKGROUND SUMMARY

The Human Services Department (HSD) through the Income Support Division (ISD) is proposing to amend the New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC) rule 8.139.410.14 NMAC ,SOCIAL SERVICES-FOOD STAMP PROGRAM-GENERAL RECIPIENT REQUIREMENTS-NONFINANCIAL ELIGIBLITY CRITERIA. These amendments are a result of the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 which was signed into law by President Biden on June 3, 2023. Changes to the rule include adding and changing language.

Specifically, the changes include:

• Subsection A of 8.139.410.14 NMAC: The age limit standards for individuals who are subject to the ABAWD work requirement.

Age Limit	Date ends
18-49	September 5 th 2023
<u>18-50</u>	September 30th 2023
18-52	September 30th 2024
<u>18-54</u>	September 30th 2025

- Subsection B through G of 8.139.410 NMAC: Letter sequences (B)-(G).
- Subsection F of 8.139.410.14 NMAC adding the following language:
 - (3) Individuals who are homeless as outlined at Subsection A of 8.139.100.7 NMAC.
 - (4) Individuals who are Veterans.
 - (5) Individuals 24 years of age or younger who were in foster care under the responsibility of the state through the maximum age permitted by the state.
- Subsection G of 8.139.410.14 changed "twelve" to "eight."

Concise Explanatory Statement:

The Department is promulgating these rules in compliance with the regulations that are outlined in the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 for Able Bodied Adults without Dependents. The rule will be amended, repealed/replaced under the statutory authority of the food stamp program as authorized by the Food Stamp Act of 1977 as amended (7 U.S.C. 2011-2036). Regulations issued pursuant to the act are contained in 7 CFR 270-282. State Authority for administering the food stamp and TANF programs are contained in Chapter 27 NMSA, 1978. Administration of the Human Services Department (HSD), including its authority to promulgate regulations, is governed by Chapter 9, Article 8, NMSA 1978 (Repl. 1983).

Waived from the time limit requirements: ISD will waive the three month time limit requirement for the following individuals in accordance with 7 CFR 273.24(f): (1) any individual residing in or relocating to a county that has an unemployment rate twenty percent above the national average as defined by ISD; **(2)** any individual residing in or relocating to pueblos, tribes, and nations, with an estimated employment to population ratio as a measure for insufficient job availability as determined by ISD. Able bodied adults who are determined to be ineligible for SNAP benefits because of noncompliance with the time limit requirements can regain eligibility in accordance with 7 CFR 273.24(d)(i), (d)(ii), (d)(iii), or (d)(v). \mathbf{F}_{\cdot} **Exceptions to the three month time limit:** Exceptions to the three month time limit required participation are found at 7 CFR 273.24(c). Physical and mental unfitness for the three month time limit requirements exception is defined as an individual who has a mental or physical illness or disability, temporary or permanent, which reduces their ability to financially support themselves.
