V. BACKGROUND SUMMARY

The Human Services Department (the Department), through the Medical Assistance Division (MAD), is proposing to amend the New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC) rule 8.308.10 NMAC, *Care Coordination*. The Department is standardizing the Health Risk Assessment tool across all Managed Care Organizations (MCOs). In addition, on April 1, 2016, the Department is implementing a Health Home initiative that includes additional care coordination requirements for Health Home members. The Department will outline specific care coordination requirements in the Centennial Care Policy Manual.

Section 9 Care Coordination:

8.308.10.9 CARE COORDINATION: sections B through K proposed language has been removed and will be defined in the Centennial Care Policy Manual.

VI. RULE

VII. EFFECTIVE DATE

The Department proposes to implement this rule effective July 1, 2016.
