



TEMPORARY AUTHORITY

Key Dates for Expiration of COVID-19 Flexibilities

Authority / Provision	Expiration Date
Medicaid Disaster State Plan Amendment (SPA)	Expires at the end of PHE or any earlier approved date elected by state
Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) Disaster SPA	COVID-19 PHE SPA: Expires at the end of PHE Evergreen Disaster SPA: Expires the later of the state-declared emergency or the end of the PHE. Both SPA types may also expire at any earlier date, at state discretion.
Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Appendix K/ Attachment K	Expires no later than six months after the expiration of the PHE (November 11, 2023) ¹
Medicaid & CHIP 1135 Waiver	Expires at the end of PHE



SUPPLEMENTAL REQUEST: EPSDT LRI PROPOSAL

- Background: The COVID-19 pandemic created a notable shortage of health care workers and made it more difficult for individuals under 21 years of age find support in their homes and communities for activities of daily living (ADLs). As a result of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE), HSD received several CMS approved emergency waivers, permitting the state to temporarily allow payment for services rendered by family caregivers or LRIs under the Fee for Service and Managed Care delivery systems.
- Proposal: HSD is proposing to supplement and enhance the Medicaid Turquoise Care 1115 renewal application to permanently allow Stateauthorized legally responsible individuals (LRIs), such as relatives and guardians, to render Personal Care Services (PCS) under the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit.

- Turquoise Care aims to expand eligibility and strengthen access to coverage, while also improving care delivery. In addition to the Medicaid eligibility groups currently enrolled in Centennial Care 2.0 and groups captured in HSD's Waiver Renewal Application, this revision allows for the continued coverage of LRIs as paid caregivers under the EPSDT benefit serving beneficiaries under the age of 21.
- Proposal Objectives:
 - Supporting access to PCS by allowing a wider pool of qualified providers;
 - Enabling individuals to receive medically necessary services in the event the traditional provider workforce is diminished or there is inadequate capacity;
 - Strengthening the provision of supports in the community using a costeffective person-centered approach; and
 - Ensuring that legally responsible individuals can be justly compensated for their caregiving work.





 Members accessing services must coordinate with appropriate provider agencies to ensure the LRI's provision of service is authorized by the Managed Care Organization or Third-Party Assessor (TPA). The LRI must meet all personal care service requirements, personal care service training, and extraordinary care requirements.

- Goal: Build a New Mexico health care delivery system where every Medicaid member has a dedicated health care team that is accessible for both preventive and emergency care that supports the whole person - their physical, behavioral, and social drivers of health.
- Hypothesis: The ability for legally responsible individuals to provide personal care services to individuals receiving EPSDT PCS services will ensure member access to EPSDT PCS services.
- Methodology: Members receiving personal care EPSDT services from legally responsible individuals will have the same or greater utilization of necessary EPSDT PCS services annually throughout the demonstration in comparison to service utilization prior to implementation of this benefit.
