RE: Tribal Notification to Request Advice and Comments Letter 24-02: Proposed amendments to 8.200.510 NMAC, General Recipient Policies, Resource Standards, 8.200.520 NMAC, General Recipient Rules, Income Standards, and 8.291.430 NMAC Affordable Care, Financial Responsibility Requirements.

Dear Tribal Leadership, Indian Health Service, Tribal Health Providers, and Other Interested Parties:

Seeking advice and comments from New Mexico's Indian Nations, Tribes, Pueblos and their health care providers is an important component of the government-to-government relationship with the State of New Mexico. In accordance with the New Mexico Human Services Department's (HSD's) Tribal Notification to Request Advice and Comments process, this letter is to inform you that HSD, through the Medical Assistance Division (MAD), is accepting written comments until **5:00 p.m., Mountain Time (MT) on May 9, 2024,** regarding proposed amendments to the following New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC) rules: *8.200.510 NMAC, General Recipient Policies, Resource Standards, 8.200.520 NMAC, General Recipient Rules, Income Standards and 8.291.430 NMAC, Affordable Care, Financial Responsibility Requirements.* 

Section 9-8-6 NMSA 1978, authorizes the Department Secretary to promulgate rules and regulations that may be necessary to carry out the duties of the Department and its divisions.

### The Department is proposing to amend the rule as follows:

The Department is amending these rules to implement the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) updates to the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) income limits for Medicaid categories of eligibility to be effective April 01, 2024, as required by HHS. HSD is also implementing the annual cost of living allowance (COLA) increase that went into effect on January 01, 2024.

### **Estimated Total Financial Impact**

The financial impact of the 2024 FPL and COLA changes may result in increased cost to HSD as more individuals may become eligible due to the higher standards.

# **Tribal Impact**

The impact of these rule changes to Native Americans is that implementation of the 2024 FPL and COLA changes may result in more Native Americans being eligible for Medicaid.
