# **FAIR HEARING**

### Can I ask for a Fair Hearing?

You have a right to fair hearing if you do not agree with some things the Human Services Department (HSD) does in your case.

#### Some reasons are:

- denying your application
- lowering your benefits
- stopping your benefits
- not timely processing your application

### What is a Fair Hearing?

A Fair Hearing is your chance to be heard. If you do not agree with what the HSD did on your case, you may ask for a fair hearing. A person who did not work on your case will look at what happened. They will say if they think the action was right or wrong. This person is called a Hearing Officer. An HSD Division Director then makes the department's final decision.

## When do I ask for a Fair Hearing?

Ask for a Fair Hearing as soon as you can. You can ask for a Fair Hearing for up to 90 days from the date of the notice of action. You can get your regular benefits until the hearing. Then you only have 13 days after the date on the notice.

You have a right to a free interpreter. Let HSD know if you will need an interpreter before or during the hearing by calling 1-800-482-5217 x 6.

## Ways to ask for a Hearing:

- Ask for a hearing at your local ISD office; or
- Fill out the hearing request section on a notice you got from ISD and return it to ISD; or
- Ask for a Fair Hearing Request form (ISD 215). Return it to the Hearings Bureau or your local ISD office. Or Fax to 1-855-824 -8960; or
- Ask for a hearing on a piece of paper and send it to ISD; or
- Call the Fair Hearings Bureau or the Customer Service Center at 1-800-283-4465.
