SNAP Dependent Care Deduction- Out of Pocket Costs

This IPP serves to clarify what should be considered an "out of ock cost in order for a household to be eligible for the SNAP dependent care deduction. Surreney, the expense deductions and standards table in policy at 8.139.500.8 F (1 shows but the amount to be considered is the "actual amount."

Households eligible for the deduction, the wish to deduct the mileage amount must provide a viable address for the child care provider so to the distance between the household's residence and its child care provider can be determined using MAPQUEST. The amount allowed for state employees, 0.41 cents per mile win be used to determine the actual amount allowed.

Example of Deduction for M eaguring state mileage rate:

A family the drives 5 miles per day 5 days per week at the state mileage rate of \$0.4. mil

10 mile roud trip $x $0.41 = $4.10 \times 20 \text{ days} = 82.00

Dependent care costs that are being reimbursed or are being paid for by a third party, such as CYFD, are not considered a deductable "out of pocket expense."
