This IPP is written to clarify the mandatory requirements as set forth by the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) and the process of cross-program crecks tower FDPIR and SNAP.

Federal regulations at 7 CFR 273.7(e) and CFR 281.1(c) and regulation at 8.139.410.11(A) NMAC explicitly state an individual or bouse old participating in a commodity distribution program administered by any India. Tribal Organization (ITO) is not eligible to receive SNAP benefits.

Furthermore, regulation at CFR 273.1 r(x) & (6), issued on February 21, 2013 and effective on March 25, 2013, requires SLA and TDPIR to perform cross-program checks to ensure participants disqualified for Intentional Program Violations (IPV's) are not allowed to participate in either program for the disqualification period of time imposed by the program.

To prevent chall participated, and to comply with the CFR, ISD Central Office sends a monthly list of SN (P hoveledds to the FDPIR sites and FDPIR sites submit monthly lists of recipients to county of the switching their service areas.

Attached is the process for cross-program checks to be completed at initial intake and recertification.

FOOD DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM ON INDIAN RESERVATIONS (FDPIR)

What is FDPIR?

FDPIR is a food distribution program funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) which provides USDA Foods to low-income household living on Indian Reservations, and on approved areas near reservations. Many households participate in FDPIR is an alternative to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance program (SLAP), due to lack of access to SNAP offices, lack of transportation or in accessibility to authorized cod stores. USDA purchases and ships USDA Foods to the FDPIR sites for distribution to eligible applicants on a monthly basis.

The Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) administer FDFR and CNAP at the Federal level. Locally, FDPIR is administered by Indian Tribal Organization (ITO's) and SNAP is administered through the New Mexico Human considers repartment Income Support Division (NMHSD ISD).

Where are the FDPIR sites locate?

Currently there are seven FDPIR sites in New Mexico and two in Arizona with whom cross-program checks must be completed. Frame refer to Attachment #1 for location, address, and contact person for FDPIR and NAI partners.

Can households participate in FDPIR and SNAP simultaneously? No.

Federal regulations governing SNAP and FDPIR prohibit dual participation. Federal regulations governing dual varticipation at 7 CFR 273.7(e) and 7 CFR 281.1(c) explicitly prohibit dual participations at 10 cm and 10

Are all ISD offices required to cross-program check for dual participation and intentional program violations? Yes.

At this point in time, ten ISD County offices located within FDPIR service areas are to perform cross-program checks for dual participation and IPV's. The county offices are:

Cibola County McKinley County Rio Arriba County
Sandoval County Taos County San Juan County
Santa Fe County Socorro County SW Bernalillo County

At what point in the application process is the cross-program check required? Cross-program checks are required at application and recertification.

What methods are used to perform cross-program checks between SNAP and FDPIR for dual participation and intentional program violations?

FNS has mandated SNAP and FDPIR to develop methods to detect dual participation and intentional program violators. Lists of currently certified households are provided to the SNAP and FDPIR offices on a monthly basis. In order to comply with the recent regulation regarding the prohibition of IPV's, these lists will now contain a monthly asting of SNA, and FDPIR participants who have been disqualified from each program.

What is the process for cross-program checks between SNAP and FDPIR?

On or about the 6th of each month, each county office receives ensting of "<u>Active FDPIR</u> <u>Participants and IPV's.</u>" Some offices will receive more than one based on their service area. The list contains the name and social security hamber of the erry participant receiving benefits.

- These lists are the primary variation to be used <u>at application/registration</u> and at <u>recertification</u> to validate St AP applicants and/or household members are <u>NOT</u> currently receiving FDPIR benefits on have an V.
- If an applicant or participating our hold is found to be on the "Active FDPIR List," the application would be derived in the basis of receiving benefits from FDPIR (Code 505).
- If an IPV discrediffication is judicated. Validation of the disqualification period is needed to determine if the apple to a seligible to apply.
- If a household rember is found to be on the "Active FDPIR List," the member would not be included in the household benefit group (Code 505).
- If the applicant's came is not found on the list you may opt to contact the local FDPIR site to candad non-receipt or receipt of SNAP benefits. As application/eligibility is ongoing household could be determined eligible in the current month and not be on the list.
- Upon completion of cross-program check proceed with eligibility.

Are telephonic cross-program checks to be made only to the ISD/FDPIR offices within the service areas?

No. ISD County offices may receive calls from FDPIR sites, outside their service area, requesting validation of SNAP participation or non-participation of applicants to FDPIR.

What happens when a case of dual participation is identified by ISD?

Upon identification of dual participation the ISD County Office is to contact the FDPIR site office relative to the service area to resolve eligibility/certification dates, establishment of claims and case disposition.

- Claims will be established by either FDPIR or the county office depending on which entity determined eligibility last.
- The Program and Policy Development Bureau (PPDB) will be notified of the incidence of dual participation via e-mail to rita.paz@state.nm.us or via telephone at 505-827-7286 upon establishment of claims and case disposition.

What happens when a case of dual participation is identified by FDPIR2

FDPIR will contact the local ISD County Office to resolve the issue. If he inchance of dual participation is reported to PPDB by FDPIR, the information will be reviewed. It ISD is the last entity making the participant eligible, a notice will be sent to the founty Directs of the responsible local ISD office requesting claims be established and to pake contact with the participant to determine case disposition.

What if a SNAP recipient requests closure in order to haply for FDIR?

When an active participant chooses to leave either St AP to apply for FDPIR or FDPIR to apply for SNAP a Termination of Program (TOP) for is to be completed and given to the participant. If preferred the TOP form can be faxed to the PIR site. (TOP Form - attachment #2)

The TOP form when provided with the FDPIR opplication for benefits provides validation to FDPIR that the individual is no longer an active SNAP participant.

FDPIR will complete the TCP form when FDPIR participant requests closure to apply for SNAP benefits. When provided the a SNAP application the TOP form will serve as validation that the individual is polonger an across FDPIR participant.
