Disqualification for Mandatory SNAP Employment & Training (E&T)

**Participants** 

This IPP serves to clarify the proper procedure for disquilifying number of SNAP Employment & Training (E&T) work program.

Effective June 1, 2013, Supplemental Nutrition as it tends Program (SNAP) recipients between the ages of 18 and 50 are mandatory to participate in the SNAP E&T work programs, unless they are exempt. Ongoing SNAP recipients will bee me handatory for the SNAP E&T work program at their next recertification.

SNAP E&T disqualification penalties are cumulative over an individual's lifetime.

Regulation at 8.139.410,12 NMAC Disqualification for noncompliance states:

- (1) Individual disqualification Any individual who fails or refuses to comply with the work registration, without good cause will be disqualified as follows:
  - (a) fine currence: until compliance or for three months, whichever is later;
  - ecologiarrence: until compliance or for six months, whichever is later;
  - (c) hird occurrence: until compliance or for one year, whichever is later.
- (2) In bindual that is voluntarily participating: Any individual that is voluntarily participling in the work program is not subject to disqualification for non-compliance with work requirements.

If a participant was previously disqualified at second level the participant would be subsequently be disqualified at a third level. The participant would not be allowed a "clean slate".
